


The AES 2025 mobile app is the hub of the meeting. Download it to be able to efficiently navigate the meeting, plan your personalized schedule, and more!

Available now for download from the App Store and the Google Play Store

- Upon downloading the app, login with your myAES credentials
- Navigate to the Agenda tab
- Search and filter the program to find your can'tmiss sessions
- Open the session and click the **Schedule** button to add it to your own, personalized schedule



Navigating the App



- View the program by session type or day then filter via the Filter menu in the upper righthand corner
 - Pro Tip: Tap the Digital Select button on the homepage to see all sessions available on-demand after the meeting. This will allow you to prioritize your time onsite!
- The Maps button will help you navigate the GWCC campus, Building B, and the Omni hotel
- Credit claim will be live in the app (and on the AES website) once the meeting begins
- Browse exhibitors and use the attendee directory to find and communicate with other attendees

- Know Before You Go: Expect an email within one week of the start of the meeting
 - Georgia World Congress Center (GWCC), Building B
 285 Andrew Young International Blvd NW, Atlanta, GA 30303
 Parking available in the GWCC Red Deck (\$16.95/day) or the Marshalling Yard (\$33.90/day)
 - Upon arrival, follow signs to pick up your badge at the registration counter
 - Stop by the ribbon wall in the registration area to say "hello" and pick up your first-timer ribbon (and others!)
 - Orient yourself! The app contains maps and floorplans to help you find your way
 - Official AES hotels listed <u>here</u>—book ASAP if you haven't already
 - AES is sharing the GWCC with the SEC! Plan ahead in the event of longer transit times getting to the convention center as well as getting through the convention center into our exclusive building
