Preparing for and Scheduling an EEG

What to Expect

How to Prepare

- Sexplain patient prep (ideal clothing, hair prep)
- Explain what the patient can expect during intake, during the EEG, and afterward
- Next steps after EEG is complete

Delivering Results and Next Steps

Clear Communication Findings

- Ø Describe the results in layman's terms
- ✓ Use visual aids (charts, graphs, or EEG printouts)

Diagnosis and/or Next Steps

- Potential diagnoses based on EEG results and symptoms
- Solution Discuss further testing or procedures if necessary

Encourage Patient Participation

- Invite the patient and/or caregiver(s) to ask questions
- Address concerns
- Ensure the patient and/or caregiver(s) understand the information provided

What the Results Mean

- Oeliver a detailed interpretation of the findings
- S Discuss possible causes for abnormal results
- Second Se

Treatment

- Recommended treatments or interventions
- Discuss pros and cons of each option

Provide Emotional Support and Resources

- Address emotional reactions (anxiety, fear, relief, concern)
- Offer support resources (counselors, support groups, etc.)
- Reassure the patient and/or caregiver(s)about the availability of ongoing support

Conclusion

Summarize Key Points

- Briefly recap appointment
- Emphasize important takeaways

Next Steps and Follow-up

- Outline next steps clearly
- Schedule follow-up appointments or further testing
- Provide contact information for future questions or concerns
